

# Presentation BEST PRACTICES



### **Basic Slide Design Tips**

- Keep It Simple: Use a template with set colors and fonts to visually simplify your presentation.
- Color Contrast: Incorporate up to 3 colors that offer contrast, see examples <u>here</u>.
- White Space: Ensure your slides are visually digestible by incorporating
  white space. Slides should contain 50% content and 50% whitespace to
  effectively convey information.
- **5-5-5 Rule:** Create slides that have no more than 5 lines, 5 words per line, 5 minutes per slide.
- Visuals: Replace text with visual cues as often as possible. People remember images easier than words and process them 60,000X faster!

#### **Ensure Accessibility**

- Transcribe or Provide Captions: Include image descriptions; ensure that closed captioning is on during any video presentations.
- Use Bullets and Lists Over Long Strands of Text:
   Avoid infographics or image-based text to ensure accessibility.
- **Font:** Sans-serif fonts are easier to read (examples: Arial, Helvetica, Calibri).
- **Text Size:** Ensure text size is at least 14pt, 24–30pt is best.
- Use Animations Sparingly: Think "Does this enhance my presentation?"

#### It's Go Time: Presenter Best Practices

- Rehearse: Focus on clarity, projecting your voice, and pacing.
- Be Strategic: Have an outline, key takeaways, calls to action, and use a timer when needed.
- Engage Your Audience: Utilize interactive questions, provide opportunities to discuss in partners and groups, and time to reflect. Explore the Durante Method, which ensures audiences are engaged to learn and adopt new strategies.
- Body Language: Focus on your posture, smile, and acknowledge the audience.
- **Be Seen and Heard:** Use a microphone if you are in-person, and move around the room to acknowledge the full audience; if you are presenting virtually, think through your lighting, webcam and microphone setup.
